MASONRY

PARTITION WALL (wooden carpentry)

The partition wall is made of double hollow brick laid with cement mortar on one side and with black plaster paste on the other side of the door frame. The door subframe is laid to the brickwork with crossed nails. On the edges of the top subframe you can see the edges of the wood. They are to join the top with the vertical wood. On the same way, the doorjambs are visible too. In the brickwork, we make a groove to place electrical wires and a plastic box for the electrical mechanisms.

The brickwork is cladded with a base coat and a setting coat made of plaster paste.

After that, the door frame has been screwed to the subframe; and after that, the door has been placed through three hinges. This door leaf is filled with cardboard. The joints between the brickwork and the door are finished through a flashing.
